General Manager's Report and Discussion

- Education department works with Spokane Public Schools for virtual lessons on World Channel, 20 minute segments, may go through the summer

Comments/Questions: Consuelo says KSPS has been a lifeline during social distancing. Patty asked if there was any feedback on the SPS partnership? Most comments have been about being sick of homeschooling, questions about age groups, but also mostly warmly received. Shaun comments on TV binging, and wonders if viewing is going down after the first several weeks of lockdown. Dawn said viewership is still way up all over.

CARES Act provided some money to each station, and PPP to cover payroll

Chief Investments & Partnerships Officer Report:

- June pledge drive is coming up. Fundraising during the lockdown has been successful
 and people are responding with support. Winter may be long and difficult, so it's good to
 raise money now before more people's personal financial situations change later in the
 year.
- Sustainers are up as well, after some cancellations from people who lost their jobs
- More free PBS programming released for on demand, which has increased Passport usage also
- Bukola's education efforts well received in the community

- Audiences are more engaged during the lockdown, there are more education blocks of programming
